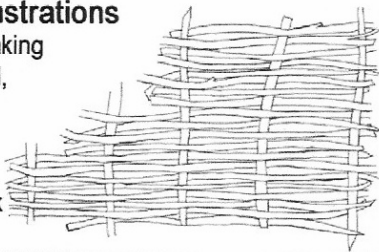

LENTEN THOUGHTS

Withyham Rectory

March 2014

Dear Everyone,

At this time of year the church still bids us, as the ‘faithful remnant’ of Christendom, to keep Lent. And we do so both for ourselves and on behalf of others.

What will be the meaning of Lent *for us*? The Church takes Lent as a time for ‘going into the wilderness’; and *the wilderness is seen as a place of truth, a place for shaking off illusion, and for the processing and healing of memories.*

Lent begins this year on 5th March with the holy day called Ash Wednesday. At the Imposition of Ashes the priest says, ‘Remember, O man, that dust thou art and unto dust shalt thou return’ (a case when, surely, only the old language will do justice to the solemnity of that thought). So yes, we are reminded of our mortality.

But we are also made to look ahead to Easter. The events of Holy Week, in which the Church participates, lead the world to the miracle of ultimate healing, with a New Life in a new dimension.

The word ‘Lent’ comes from the same word root as ‘lengthening’, which in the Northern hemisphere is of course what the days do at this time of year. Perhaps we feel ambivalent about the longer days. They call us out of hibernation – too soon! ‘April is the cruellest month’ wrote T.S.Eliot, echoing the beginning of Chaucer’s *Canterbury Tales*. The idea expressed here is that April is ‘cruel’ because the longer days, by bringing more daylight, force us to examine things we might not wish to face up to.

But when we can do so, Lent can become for us what the Church has always intended it to be: *a time of powerful healing for the soul.*

And we shall also wish keep Lent, as I said at the beginning, on behalf of others. Remember that the church community – that’s us – keeps feast and fast on behalf of a world in which such things seem to have been forgotten.

With every blessing, and prayers that this Lent may be a time of healing.

FROM THE PARISH REGISTERS

Churchwarden's Notes - March.

And so the rain continues. I checked with a number of timber merchants last week (just in case), but they were completely out of gopher wood and had available no ways of measuring in in cubits.

Some reminders:

5th March is Ash Wednesday and there will be a short service at 8.00 p.m., together with the imposition of ashes.

The Parochial Church Meeting will take place on **Friday 25th April** in the village hall.

The **Church Spring Clean** is scheduled for **Saturday 26th April**. All help will be gratefully received.

Waitrose Community Project. As you will know, many of the functions run by the village hall committee directly benefit our church. Now is your opportunity to repay this help in the easiest way possible. The village hall made a submission to be considered as a Waitrose Community Project and we have received confirmation that we have been accepted. This hasn't been a particularly quick process as it was applied for in February 2013. For those of you who are unaware of the scheme, it operates by offering customers a token, at check-out, which they drop into one of three boxes depending upon which organization they wish to support. Waitrose donates £1000 each month to these three organizations and it is divided proportionally depending on how many tokens they each have. So the more tokens we have the greater amount of money we receive. The Hall's name will appear in the Crowborough store in April and Sun Hwa and I shall certainly be stockpiling our tokens until then. Could I implore you to do the same?

Mothering Sunday: This falls on 30th March this year and we will be holding an All Age Service at 11.00am. Mothering Sunday, traditionally, was a day when young people working away from home would try to return, to bring presents and share a meal. The earliest references to it occur in the mid-17th century. This is not to be confused with the American invention of Mother's Day, which was first suggested in 1913. Congress recognised it in 1913 and it was set as the second Sunday in May. Some efforts were made in Britain to introduce it after the First World War, but it was not until the Second World War and the influx of American Servicemen, that it took off. This was due, in no small part, to the influence of the Greeting Card Industry. Mothering Sunday and Mother's Day conflated, with the term Mother's Day winning out, at least in the card shops. American Mother's Day still has a later date than Mothering Sunday and perhaps, if we all keep asking for Mothering Sunday cards, we can re-impose the traditional term. Meanwhile, all you bakers out there, it's time to start thinking about Frumenty and Simnel Cake.

The spring show this year will be on Saturday the 12th April. Before this we have a Quiz Night on Friday 28th March. Please make sure that you book a table in plenty of time. Phone either me (01892 661940) or Helen (01892 771044).

On Saturday 5th April, between 9 a.m. and 12 noon, there will also be 20% off all plant purchases at Royal Mires Nurseries. This is a great opportunity to get your spring and summer plants, but you will have to have this year's membership card, which you can get from Liz Hunt or one of the committee can ensure that you will get your card on time. The subs have increased this year to £3.50 (£3.00 for over 60s).

I will be at the spring show to take money for the first trip, which will be to Beth Chatto Gardens on Saturday 17th May. The price is £20 for non-members, and £17 for members, so if you join you will get your subscription back! Can't be bad!!

Garden tips for this month are:

1. If you have a small garden, many vegetables such as beetroot, carrots, spring onions, spinach, lettuce and radishes (anything you fancy really) can be grown in containers. Just make sure they are kept well fed and watered and, of course, have a decent enough depth to grow in.
2. Lawns have taken a real bashing this winter, so will need extra care such as draining and raking as moss seems to have taken over in some places. Grass is now growing so your first cut should be done very gently (if its dried out enough that is!).
3. Re-awaken overwintered plants by bringing them into the light. Tidy up the dead leaves and debris and start to increase watering.
4. Bring in bags of compost as this will warm it up and increase germination rates when you sow your greenhouse crops such as tomato, cucumber, aubergines, peppers, melons etc.

The Groombridge & Hartfield GP Surgeries Patient Participation Group (PPG)

The PPG is organised and supported by the Surgery GPs Dr Matt James and Dr Andrew Wolffe.

The PPG will be holding an open morning on Saturday 8th March from 9.45 a.m. at Groombridge Village Hall. All patients of the surgeries are warmly invited to attend. The Doctors will be speaking about the new NHS Clinical Commissioning arrangements and how this will affect the services delivered by the surgeries. They will also speak about the work of the PPG and what it has achieved on behalf of the Villages' patients over the last 18 months.

Georges Méliès and *Shooting the Moon*

Strangeface have toured mask theatre across the UK and internationally since 2001. We have worked with classic adaptations such as Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* and created original works such as *The Last Resort* (an award-winning piece that went to the Mobarak Puppet Festival in Tehran!)

This year we have gone back to a project Artistic Director Russell Dean began in 1998 on the story of the Cinemagician Georges Méliès. Méliès was a French illusionist and filmmaker famous for leading many technical and narrative developments in the earliest days of cinema. Méliès, a prolific innovator in the use of special effects, accidentally discovered the jump cut in 1896, and was one of the first filmmakers to use multiple exposures, time-lapse photography, dissolves, and hand-painted color in his work. Two of his best-known films are *A Trip to the Moon* (1902) and *The Impossible Voyage* (1904). Both stories involve strange, surreal voyages, somewhat in the style of Jules Verne and his work was recently captured in the Martin Scorsese film "Hugo".

Our story unfolds in a series of memories; his life flashing before his eyes as Georges takes his final breath. We see him as a young man in his father's boot factory, falling in love, learning magic and the magic of the camera. There are stories of his success, growing family, and eventual fall from favour as his celluloid was melted down by the army to make boots! This is all done in our handmade masks without words, just like Méliès' films. There are farcical routines, shadow puppet scenes, beautiful original musical pieces and some classic sounds from the world of the Belle Époque.

The production is a touching, gentle and thought provoking. We also promise to make you laugh and offer of an informal opportunity to have a look behind the scenes at the end of the show. Feedback from our first performances includes:

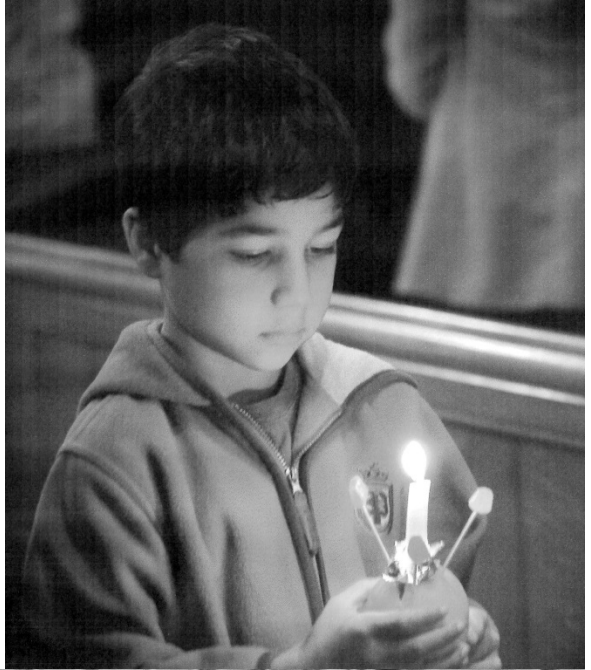

ST MICHAEL'S CHRISTINGLE SERVICE

These pictures were taken by Julie Ruse at the **Christingle Service**, which took place in St Michaels Church on Sunday 15th December. Elizabeth Parish directed her usual amazing production of the nativity, with a minimum of rehearsals.

The children elocuted beautifully and confidently, clad in the most amazing and imaginative costumes. Their Mothers are enormously to be commended!! In spite of the dangers involved in the possibility of incendiaries in the church, the service went off without a hitch.



Artist of the Month – William Holman Hunt 1827 – 1910

The son of a warehouse manager, he worked as an office clerk before taking up painting and in 1844/5, he was accepted by the Royal Academy Schools. He formed a friendship with John Everett Millais at this time. They would later be joined by Dante Gabriel Rossetti and in September 1848, at 83 Gower Street, London, the house of the Millais family, the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood was formed.

Among the aims of the Brotherhood were to have genuine ideas to express, to study nature attentively and to produce thoroughly good pictures and statues, remaining true to the principles of close observation to the subject matter.

Hunt was ambitious, arrogant, obstinate and unlikeable. He was also a great procrastinator and found it impossible to keep to a timetable. In fact, he was generally thought to have very little natural talent and his strength lay in the fact that he was very determined to become an artist. It was only his sheer determination that would keep him going. Since he was a boy he had dreamed of painting biblical scenes in the Holy Land. Whilst there he had to defend himself against robbers, was caught in the crossfire taking place between rival factions and contracted malaria. Despite these incidents he chose to build his own house in Jerusalem.



He married Fanny Waugh who died in Florence during childbirth. Later he flouted English law and married his late wife's sister in Switzerland, thus causing a rift in the family.

He would eventually give up painting due to failing eyesight because he could not achieve the quality that he had previously attained.

Claudio & Isabella 1850

This painting was inspired by Shakespeare's play Measure for Measure. Isabella discusses with her imprisoned brother Claudio the possibility of giving her virginity to Angelo, the absent Duke's deputy, in return for her brother's life. Hunt inscribed on the picture frame "Claudio. Death is a fearful thing. Isabella. And shamed life is hateful".

Action points from the last two meetings can be found on our website, our Facebook page or can be obtained from the WPC Clerks (*see back of magazine*).

We hope that you have received and enjoyed our first Newsletter. Feedback received has been very positive, and we are very grateful for offers to assist in delivering it next time. If you have not received a copy please do contact the Clerks.

Road Safety: East Sussex County Council's Highways Department is proposing a Community Self-Serve scheme. WPC is inviting a representative from ESCC to present the proposals at the next meeting and hopes to be able to make more information available about what this might mean for parishes through the newsletter and the Open Day/APA. WPC is also setting up a Road Safety Committee in response to these proposals, more information on this to follow.

Birchden Woods/Harrison Rocks facilities: As previously reported, if a viable lessee is not found for the toilet, campsite and car park by November 2014, the toilet block will be demolished and the camp site and lower half of the car park will be closed. This is a major facility enjoyed by our community as well as being a tourist attraction that brings business to our shops, and it would be a disaster if this was allowed to deteriorate. It could also result in a health and safety issue. The Parish Council is organising a **consultation week at its offices 3-8 March**, times to be displayed on boards around the Parish, on the website, Facebook and from the Clerks.

Parish Office: as Spa Valley Railway (SVR) is now subletting part of the Old Station, its team of volunteers are building a ticket office and reinstating the doors onto the platform.

On Saturday 26th April 2014, there will be an Open Day at The Old Station, please see our advert for further details. Both SVR and WPC will be holding various events. WPC will also be incorporating the Annual Parish Assembly (APA), and will be seeking views from people across the parish on its Parish Plan priorities for the coming years. WPC hopes that by combining the events, more young people might be able to contribute.

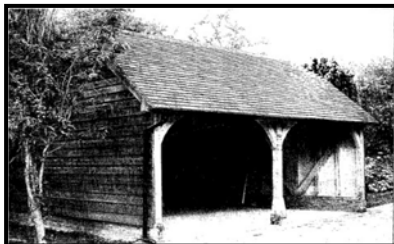

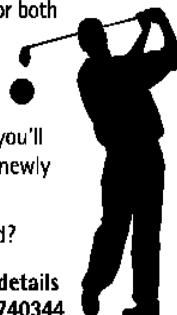

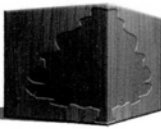
