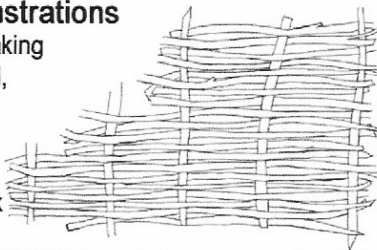

from the ancient Easter Liturgy

Dear Everyone,

At Christmas we travelled *‘in heart and mind to Bethlehem, to see this thing that is come to pass and the Babe lying in manger’* – in the words of the Bidding at the carol service three months ago.

But now is the time to travel *in heart and mind to Jerusalem*. Here we would catch a vision, beyond the Infant Christ of the family carol service, to the stark reality of the engagement between Christ and the dark forces of ‘this world’.

This is the pivot-point of the Church’s year. Come and participate, *in heart and mind*: at the Lord’s final entry into the holy city of Jerusalem on Palm Sunday; be with him in the Upper Room on Maundy Thursday; stand *afar off* from the Cross on Good Friday. Rest on Holy Saturday, as he rested in the Tomb; then, on Easter Eve, ‘in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life’, come and join in the Easter Vigil (Please see below (page 3), for details and explanations of these services).

One response to the problems and pains of our lives, and to a sense of darkness in the world, is to make the decision to participate in the liturgy of Holy Week. This will do three things: (1) It will remind us of the spiritual conflict in which the Church must be engaged; (2) It will speak of victory; and (3) It will be a witness to our allegiance.

At the Easter Vigil service, while the new Easter Candle is being prepared and lit, the priest says some very ancient and moving words: *By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard us and keep us*. And then, when it is actually lit: *May the Light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds*.

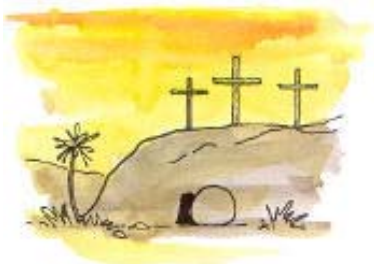

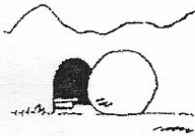

WITHYHAM HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY April 2014

By this time we should have had our March quiz so I hope that we made a lot of money for our funds.

The next event will be Royal Mires on Saturday the 5th April where you can, when you bring along your membership card, get a very generous 20% off all plant buys (excluding sale items, of course). The sale starts at 9 a.m. and will finish at 12 noon so make sure you get there in plenty of time. Following that we have the spring show on Saturday the 12th April and as all the narcissi have come very early this year we will have to make sure all the other classes are well supported. Even if you are not showing this time come along for a lovely cream tea.

Our first trip to Beth Chatto gardens is two thirds booked so if you would like to go please get in touch with me as the seats are going very fast all details will be in your membership cards and of course the show schedules, the cost is £17 for members and £20 for non-members. All are welcome.

Garden tips for this month: 1. Sow half-hardy herbs such as basil and coriander on a sunny window-sill 2. Prune winter heathers, cut back the flowered stems, make a clean cut below the base of the flower head reducing height by about a third, this helps keep plant compact and encourages new growth. 3. Apply fertiliser to fruit crops coming into flower now such as gooseberries, currants and forced strawberries under glass; use a high potash to improve quality. For crops in pots choose a liquid fertiliser but a granular fertiliser for fruit grown in the ground. 4. Check for lily beetles (I was listening to the Kent radio gardening programme last week and someone phoned in to say they had already seen one!)

We look forward to seeing you all at Royal Mires and the Spring Show.

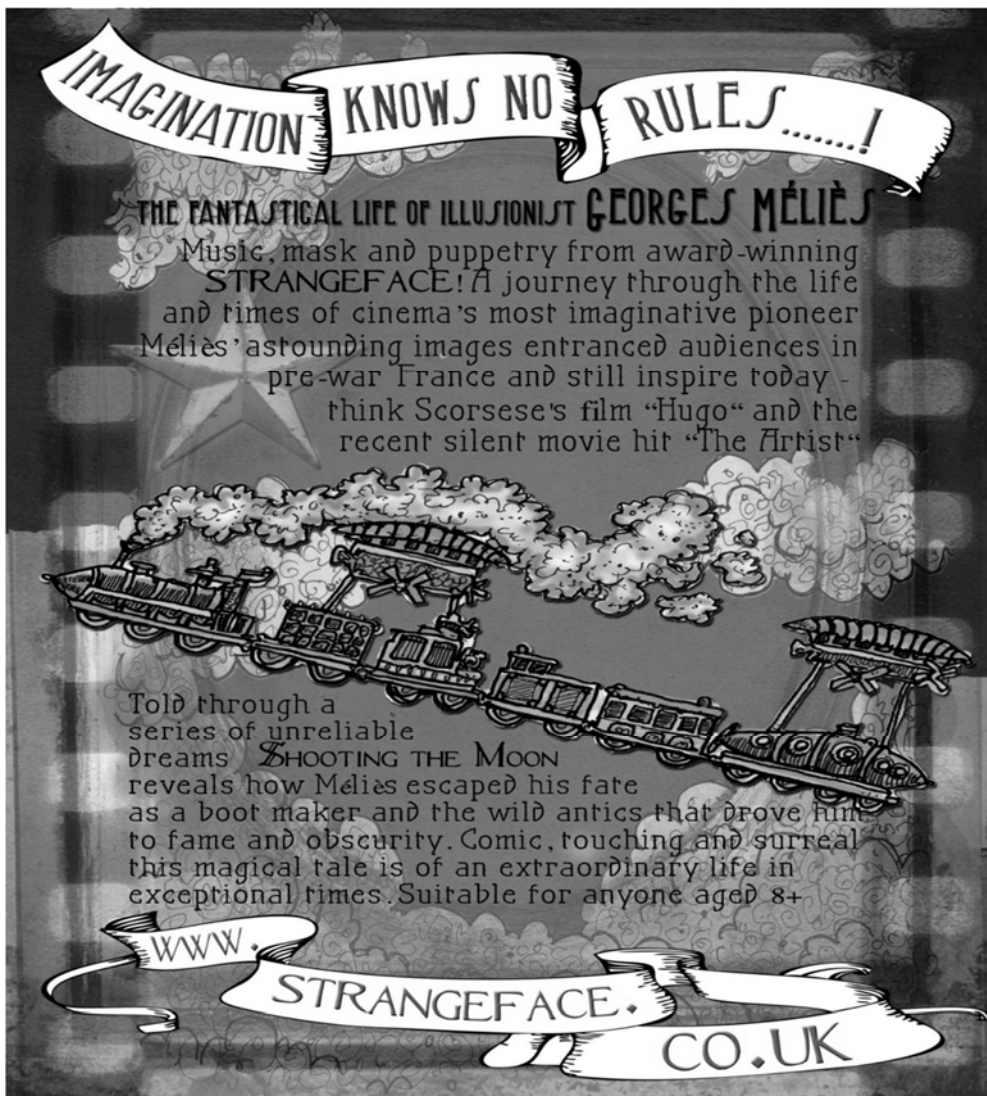

Artist of the Month: Henri Matisse (1869 – 1954)

Even though Matisse admitted himself that he was dreamy, frail and not very bright, his mother, he said, “loved everything I did”. His father was a grain merchant and the house that he was born into had two rooms, a beaten earth floor and a roof that Matisse remembered dripped water above his bed when it rained. He was initially destined to follow his father into the grain business.

When he was 18 years old he went to Paris to study law and became a court administrator. However, despite passing the bar exams with distinction he regarded the law as tedious. His heart was set on being a painter much to the disappointment of his father. Whilst convalescing after an illness his mother bought him some art supplies. Matisse said that “From the moment I held the box of colours in my hands, I knew this was my life”.

In 1898 Matisse married Amelie Parayre and studied Turner’s works in London for a short time. He experimented with many styles of painting during the late 1800’s and the early 1900’s and became the leading figure of Fauvism. The Fauves sought a movement that was a more dynamic way of depicting nature. This style of painting is characterised by fierce, expressive and unnaturalistic colour. The name Fauves comes from the French term “Wild Beasts” and was applied to them by the art critic Louis Vauxcelles.

In the 1940’s Matisse’s health was failing and he was suffering from severe arthritis. It was during this time that he made large cut out paper pictures. He called this technique “painting with scissors”. He was confined to a wheelchair in 1941. Towards the end of his life he had a burst of creativity and his work even entered the realms of graphic arts and book illustrations.

His final endeavour was a four year project completing the interior of the Chapelle du Rosaire in Vence. This exhausted him and by this stage he had to attach his brush to a long pole in order to complete the task. He once said that he sought to create a serene, balancing act that would “soothe the brain”. He died at the age of 84 of a heart attack.



The Sadness of the King (La Tristesse du Roi) 1952: For this painting Matisse used a découpage. This is the art of cutting designs out of paper and pasting them onto a surface. Assistants would prepare the large sheets of paper with gouache. Matisse would cut his shapes from a palette of 11 colours and then he would paste them on to the surface. The King is regarded as a self-portrait silhouette of Matisse in his wheelchair.

WITHYHAM PARISH COUNCIL (WPC) March 2014

Action points from the last two WPC meetings can be found on our website, our Facebook page or can be obtained from the WPC Clerks.

Bushcraft workshops will be running this year in Withyham/Blackham. Funding may be available from WPC under the Grant's process.

WDC reported that details of a free advice line about Benefits will be sent out with Council Tax Bills. The judicial review against the Wealden Development Plan by the Ashdown Forest Economic Forum (AFEF) was made in favour of WDC. AFEF is likely to appeal.

Harrison Rocks Consultation: WPC thanks all residents who took time to attend the Consultation in the Parish Office. A paper was presented, which included public preferences and qualifying comments. Comments by the public showed that a clear mandate was not apparent. Residents appeared to prefer that WPC was involved in the Birchden Woods Community Interest Company (BWCIC), they did not wish WPC to take on any financial risk. It was therefore resolved that WPC attempt to become a full member with equal voting rights and if this option is not open to us then explore with the Forestry Commission an option that allows WPC to fully represent the interests of the community without any financial risk.

Ward Reports:

Groombridge ward: Research with the Diocese of Chichester has revealed that St Thomas churchyard is not owned by WPC as it automatically transferred to the incumbent of the Benefice following its consecration in 1928.

St Johns ward: A suitable resident is being sought to fill the vacant Ward Councillor position.

Withyham/Blackham ward: Three quotations are being sought for equipment for the Balls Green Playground. There had been much interest in forming a Balls Green Residents Association. The petition by Blackham residents for a footpath on the A264 from Blackham to the sports pavilion in Ashurst had been received by WPC and would be passed to ESCC. A suitable resident is being sought to fill the vacant Ward Councillor position.

Police Report: There has been an increase in oil thefts reported in Hartfield. Report any vans trailing flexi pipes seen near houses with oil tanks. A leaflet is available from Sussex Police on how to protect your oil tank from thieves.

Precept 2014/2015: WPC has requested an increase in its Precept from WDC to cover the increasing number of responsibilities and expenses they are taking on and having to fund. Until now WPC has used their savings to cover the shortfall. This is not good financial housekeeping.

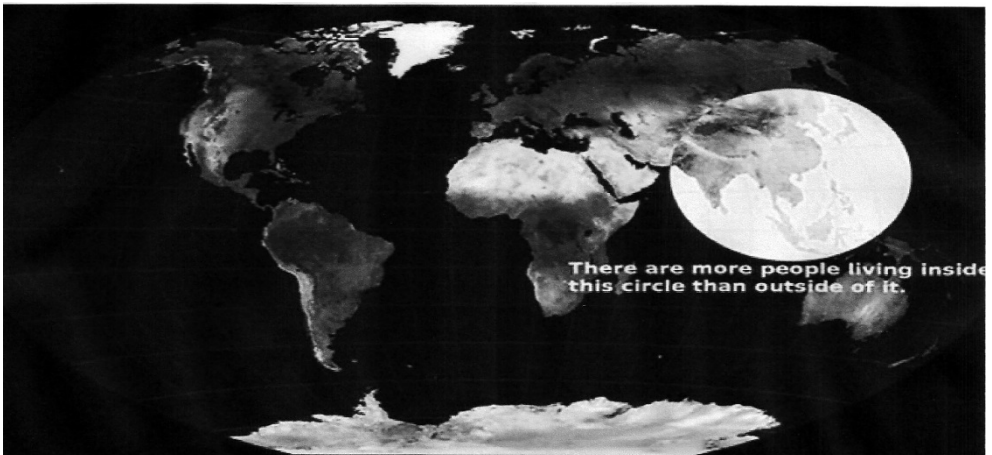

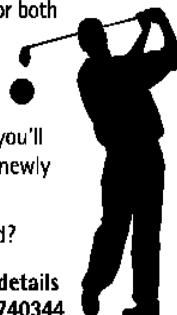

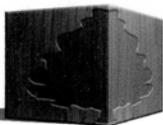
