



#### Letter from the Rectory – April 2021

#### Dear Friends,

There is a story about a taxi driver and a vicar. Seeing his passenger's dog collar, the taxi driver remarked over his shoulder, "I feel sorry for you Christians." He looked anything but sorry – his shoulders were shaking with laughter. "There you all are," he went on, "you pin everything on your belief in an after-life. You work, pray ... and then when you get to the end, you'll discover there's nothing there after all!"

The vicar laughed too - it seemed the right response. "That's all very well," he said, "but supposing I am wrong – there's no heaven, no after-life or anything like that. Even so, I still win! Here I am, deluded, making my way through life, firm in my conviction that life isn't the product of chance. I believe with millions of others that we are here on this world for a purpose, and that a man called Jesus Christ has beaten back death on behalf of us all. In my delusion, I'm motivated by the sense of his presence with me every day. So, when I come to the end of my days, I go out into eternity believing that my energies have been spent for a lasting purpose. And then, if you are right, I won't even have the disappointment of knowing that I was wrong!"

"But you," the vicar continued, warming to his theme, "suppose that you are wrong and I am right. There you are, struggling to make a living and to earn enough money to keep yourself together – and you don't even know why! You try to make sense of existence, living life off your own batteries and hoping for the best. You fight off illness and decay for as long as possible, but in the end you have to accept that you will die. And then you are in for a terrible shock – you will find yourself confronted by the very person you have ignored all your life. You'll realise that everything you have been living for was wasted - it has all been for nothing. Now, just supposing ...". But the taxi-driver wasn't listening any more – he was busy doing a U-turn. If only he could have done the same with his thinking, the vicar reflected.

The vicar who told this story was Richard Bewes, one-time Rector of All Souls Church, Langham Place in Central London. He concludes, 'Was Jesus really raised from the dead? Millions of people have come to the breath-taking conclusion that something really did happen on that first Easter Day – something that can change each of our lives.'

#### Family Support Work - March 2021 update

#### Dear Friends,

I write this as schools are reopening to all pupils for the first time since last year. It is fair to say that our families have found this latest period of lockdown and homeschooling very challenging, but overall they have been incredibly resilient and managed to get through it, thanks to the fantastic support offered by our practitioners. As we make tentative steps back into some sort of normality, we are very proud that our families have coped so well over the last year.

We are interviewing candidates this week for the new practitioner roles that were mentioned in my last update and hope to have some good news regarding appointments shortly, which we will of course share with you as soon as we can.

After some hugely generous donations to our food bank over Christmas which kept us well stocked throughout January and February, we are now running low on many items. If anybody is in a position to arrange a food collection, we are in need of nearly everything, with the exception of pasta and tinned tomatoes, of which we have plenty. Tinned meats and fish, tinned vegetables and fruit, soup, tea/coffee and table sauces would be particularly welcome. We are able to collect if you have a large quantity of donations – please contact Spencer in the office on 01273 832963 or by email <a href="mailto:spencer@familysupportwork.org.uk">spencer@familysupportwork.org.uk</a> if this is the case.

With the Government's road map giving us some of idea when we may be able to resume our face-to-face activities, we are planning how to do this both safely and successfully, and I hope to be able to share news with you in the next update of our plans for the rest of the year. In the meantime, thank you all for continuing to share our news and support us in prayer during the last month.

#### February's work in numbers

- 311 individual visits and 163 support calls with families supporting 33 grandparents, 354 parents and 296 children
- 18 supported meetings with other agencies carried out remotely
- 24 online group sessions held, including half-term activities
- 396 food deliveries made

#### Prayer points

- Pray for wisdom for our interview panel in selecting the right candidates for the new practitioner roles
- Give thanks for recent funding successes that will provide some stability in the coming months
- Pray that our staff remain healthy both physically and mentally after an incredibly tough few weeks

#### Address given by Michael Goolden at the Funeral of Rosemary Goolden at Withyham Church on 25<sup>th</sup> February

99 years ago today ... Rosemary or Ro or Granny Butter or Ro-Ro was born. Her father was Christopher Lowther and her mother Dorothy Bromley Davenport ... she did have strong opinions and values, which were a firm guiding force throughout her life ... her early years were touched with great sadness ... a sister was born but died as a baby ... when she was 12 her father ... died suddenly.

Ro was sent off to boarding school ... and then to France and Austria to learn French and German. Her teens were decidedly unsettled. When War broke out, she enlisted in the Wrens at the age of 17 ... rising to the rank of  $2^{nd}$  Officer. But the War brought further sadness as all three of her half brothers were killed.

It was during the War that she met Douglas, introduced by their mutual friend Frank Giles, and they were married on 7th July 1945 in Mayfair, when Ro was 23. Frank and Kitty were great friends throughout their lives, and it was through them that they came to live in Withyham over 70 years ago ... one friend wrote, 'Along with the Church and the Dorset Arms, Ro was Withyham.'

Horses always played a big part in Ro's life. She had ponies as a little girl ... and continued to ride right into her 80s. Dogs were also important to her ... Wilkes ... succeeded by a succession of Basset Hounds – Cheerful, Bashful, Blissful, Joyful and Bonnie ... and the last was Maud, a much-loved border terrier.

(Later) ... she volunteered with the WRVS ... Meals-on-Wheels ... a Governor and great supporter of the Village School ... and set up the Withyham Art Group.

In due course, grandchildren came along ... then great-grandchildren ... the sad end of an era ... thank you and goodbye to our lovely and wonderful mother.

#### Robert Murray Willis 1952-2021

Robert died at Pembury on 6<sup>th</sup> February having contracted Covid-19 only a couple of weeks or so before. His death was a terrible blow to his much-loved family – Fenella and their children Tom, Will and Lucy, his elderly mother Kay and older brothers James and Charlie. It was a shock too to the many people who knew him locally, since he and Fenella moved from Tunbridge Wells to the Rectory Wing eight years ago.

In the announcement of his death in the Daily Telegraph the family described Robert as an 'adventurer, naturalist, gold miner, Royal Engineer, 'free spirit' and wonderful storyteller.'

Anyone who knew Robert would know that one side of A5 would never begin do him justice; the anecdotes and stories that accompanied him through his life were just too many.

# NOTES FROM WITHYHAM PARISH COUNCIL Withyham Parish Council serves residents of Blackham, New Groombridge (the East Sussex side of the River Grom), Marden's Hill (St John's, Crowborough) and Withyham.

Withyham Parish Council (WPC) met on Monday 8th March 2021. To follow are the headlines plus other news. Full action from this meeting is available on our website <a href="https://www.withyhamparishcouncil.org.uk">www.withyhamparishcouncil.org.uk</a> and Facebook on <a href="https://www.www.facebook.com/">www.facebook.com/</a> WithyhamParishCouncil. Minutes can also be obtained from the Clerks at the Parish Office.

The Parish Council is currently conducting its Council and Planning meetings remotely via 'Zoom'. Members of the public can view meetings via the WPC YouTube channel where they are shown until the minutes become available. Members of the public wishing to attend or address items on the agendas should email their question / comment to the Clerk by the morning of the meeting.

Members of **Groombridge Men's Sheds** joined the first ten minutes of the meeting on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> to discuss a couple of conditions in the draft underlease. It was agreed that further legal advice should be sought and the outcome discussed with GMS. Everybody was congratulated on getting the project to this stage. It is hoped that we are within sight of a finish to the legal paperwork!

**GRANTS:** Residents new to the parish may not know that we have a fantastic scheme for supporting local initiatives. Every year we set aside an agreed amount in our budget to fund local projects up to £2000. Those wishing to be considered are asked to describe their intended activity, the expected benefit to the community and how much they are requesting from WPC to achieve their aims and objectives. The applicants are required to attend a meeting of the Finance Committee to answer any questions that councillors might need for clarification. It all sounds very formal but can be well worth it, as a resident from Balls Green found on Monday. He applied for a grant to help make residents in Withyham more secure and safer with their businesses and homes. Having observed how successful Blackham Village Watch has been, residents of Withyham would like to form Withyham Watch. It is intended that by investing in signs, stickers and other deterrents, it will demonstrate that Withyham is a community being vigilant and proactive in preventing rural theft. The Parish Council was pleased to support this initiative.

In the last year we have also funded materials for scrubs (Covid 19), new gates at Blackham Village Hall, CCTV and signage for Blackham Watch, support for youth activities at Clued Up in Crowborough, contributed to the running costs of Wealden Citizens Advice and put money towards volunteer tools for the Ashdown Conservators, to name but a few! Churches, schools, organisations and clubs have all benefited from this Grants system, of which we are very proud.

**PARISH PLAN:** Yes, we are forging ahead with this in spite of Covid 19 making it difficult for us to consult you, but we are using all the social media platforms we have to seek your views, as well as writing to you. It is so important that we evaluate the activities that drove our previous five years as this will help us to determine how we can support you in the community for the next five, and highlight new challenges.



**GROOMBRIDGE POST OFFICE:** In spite of this current lockdown, the council is making progress with securing the post office. As you know, we have set in motion the mechanisms to buy the building in which the Post Office is housed, as it will be so much more convenient for residents to continue to access the Post Office if it is part of the 'hub' of shops that are located in Groombridge. To date:

- A building survey of the premises has been undertaken
- An application to the Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) has been made to enable the
  purchase of the building. This is a lending facility operated on behalf of HM Treasury for local
  authorities such as town and parish councils to fund capital projects. Our solicitor remains on
  standby to start conveyancing as soon as the PWLB loan is confirmed, and set up the
  commercial lease between WPC and the Community Interest Company which we had to
  form.
- The contract with Post Office Ltd has been signed and returned, following an interview with the Clerk and the Chair, as two of the Directors of the Community Interest Company
- Architect Plans are being finalised asap so that we may go out with specs for conversion quotes
- A Building Group is overseeing checks on utilities and the separation of the residential part of the building from the post office to enable the high standard of security required by Post Office Ltd.

#### We now look forward to:

- · Instructing our solicitor to purchase the building once the loan has been agreed
- · Recruiting and training up a third post office staff member
- Confirming post office counter staff and negotiating job descriptions and contracts for existing members of staff; we couldn't do without their knowledge and experience, could we?!
- Identifying work to be done to establish a flourishing retail side
- Engaging and training volunteers for the retail side
- Undertaking conversion and shop fitting to separate the post office premises from the residential part of the building. (This will enable Rosie, the current post mistress, to lease that part for a while, and create some income for the Parish Council to offset the overall costs).

There will be many other tasks in addition to this list that are all very challenging, but we are determined they will result in saving the Post Office. Thank you to all of you who are giving your time to supporting us in this venture.



**GROOMBRIDGE PLAYGROUND:** The Play Area refurbishment team are looking at ways in which the playground can be opened this Spring, but they require volunteers to respond to the safety evaluation that has shown it needs 1) new playground bark chips and 2) minor maintenance such as a coat of paint to some equipment. Please look out for contact details or contact the clerk; details below if you are able to help.

#### A Blackham Walk



I did this walk the other day and really enjoyed it - it's not too long (3.75 miles) and the views are long and lovely. It's also very quiet, and despite the fact that there is a bit of road walking, the roads are not busy and you're unlikely to get mown down. It is fairly undulating and there is one pretty steep climb near the beginning, but what is it they say about 'no pain, no gain'? It was muddy in places too, though that should improve with the coming spring and summer weather. For now, you'll definitely want good boots or even wellies. I haven't included a printed map of the area for fear of getting sued but here is a perfectly legitimate link which you may or may not want to make use of -

Start from the junction of Ironchurch Lane and Willetts Lane and walk N along Ironchurch Lane to the church. Turn right down the hill, over the railway bridge and past the golf course, and over Kent Water to a sharp right-hand bend. Go straight on up the drive to Hobbs Hill Farm and when the drive turns left into the farm carry straight on onto a bridleway. Climb steeply upwards to the top and then keep following the bridleway (lovely views back towards Blackham) until you reach Bassetts Lane. Turn left along the lane past Frienden Farm to Bassetts Mill, and then left into the drive to Prinkham. When you reach Prinkham, go along a narrow footpath to the left of the house and emerge into a field. Turn half right across the corner of the field and over a stile into a larger field. Turn left and walk along the field in a roughly southerly direction, heading for a footbridge over Kent Water. Once over the bridge and safely back in East Sussex, carry straight on uphill, heading for a bridge over the railway. You can pause here and do a bit of trainspotting, though you may need to be patient. Carry straight on across the next field until you reach an east-west track. Turn left. In a few paces you reach a small wood on the right. Technically, there is a footpath diagonally through this wood but it's very indistinct, so you're better continuing along the path you're on, until you reach the entrance of Nore Farm. Turn right up the drive to reach Sussex Lane by a house called 'Chippings'. Turn left back to the church and then right down Ironchurch Lane back to the start.

#### Withyham AED - Automated External Defibrillator

We reported last year that there is now a defibrillator housed on the external wall of the Kings' Hall for use in a cardiac arrest emergency. The machine has a recorded sequence of messages to explain how to use the device; therefore it can be used by anyone in an emergency, allied to CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), particularly chest compressions. No shock will be applied unless the machine has detected that this is an appropriate course of action. Recently the machine was used; the responders were pleased to inform the Hall that it was easy to use and very reassuring, because they learned that the patient was not in cardiac arrest and so did not need a shock. The patient made a good recovery. However, the responders advised that many people they know were not aware that the machine was available, so we are repeating the notification. There are similar machines in both Hartfield and Groombridge, outside their village halls.
