





Letter from the Rectory – May 2021

Dear Friends,

In October, the BBC's 'Songs of Praise' celebrates 60 years. Last autumn, Katie Piper joined the team. She is perhaps best known for her incredible bravery in coping with severe facial burns and blindness in one eye after an acid attack arranged by an ex-boyfriend.

Katie wasn't brought up in a Christian home and religion really played no part in her life until the brutal acid attack in 2008. Lying in a hospital bed in agony, severely disfigured, she remembers not wanting to look at anyone or anyone to look at her, of being scared of people and scared of the world.

A brave nurse spoke to her about God in the hospital. "Had anyone known", Katie said, "she would probably have been sacked for breaking ethics. But she was just doing it out of Christian kindness to comfort me. I remember her telling me, "Things happen for a reason. This is not the end. God has great things in store for you." That night I prayed for the first time. Then the weirdest thing happened. The room seemed incredibly bright, and I felt I was being enveloped in a warm hug. A voice in my head said, 'Everything's going to be OK." I felt an incredible sense of being loved."

When she left hospital, Katie joined a church and started exploring the Christian Faith. She went on to say how much her local church leaders supported her ... "They were a massive part of my recovery, and so was God and faith." Katie's gruelling journey to recovery has involved more than 200 operations, including pioneering surgery to reconstruct her face and restore her vision. Last November she celebrated her fifth wedding anniversary with Richard Sutton; they have two daughters, Belle and Penelope.

Amongst many other things, Katie has survived being on 'Strictly Come Dancing', despite never actually having watched the show until she took to the dance floor, and featuring in 'Hello' Magazine. More importantly, she founded the 'Katie Piper Foundation' to help victims of burns and other disfiguring injuries and released a best-selling autobiography. She and her mother both appeared as guests on an edition of 'Songs of Praise' last year when she spoke about her journey of faith.

We have a record number of dates this year and are in need of support for these, particularly from cake bakers. Churchwardens' Notes


The much awaited resumption of worship in church began with a Communion service on Easter Day.

Withyham Parish Council (WPC) met on Monday 19th April 2021. To follow are the headlines, plus other news. The Parish Council is currently conducting its Council and Planning meetings remotely via 'Zoom'. Members of the public can view meetings via the WPC YouTube channel where they are shown until the minutes become available. Members of the public wishing to attend or address items on the agendas should email their question / comment to the Clerk by the morning of the meeting. At the above meeting we were very pleased to welcome a resident from St Johns, who came to observe our meeting before we discussed his application to become a councillor for Marden's Hill Ward.

WARD REPORTS - GROOMBRIDGE

THE TANYARD: It is regrettable that the Management Committee of the Groombridge Sports Ground Association has had to ban dog walking on the Tanyard from the 1st of May, but quite understandable in the light of the dog fouling that they have had to clear up before children can play football and other games. Most of us are aware of the serious health risks caused by the presence of *Toxocara canis* in dog messes. It contaminates the soil for several years, causing blindness, particularly in children. The Parish Council provides dog bins in strategic places at a cost for emptying of £250 per bin per year. It is therefore very disheartening, when out for a walk, to see coloured bags of dog mess hung in trees and bushes. Most dog owners are meticulous in cleaning up after their dog. As usual it is the very few who spoil it for the majority.

GROOMBRIDGE PLAYGROUND: The current playground remains closed due to the last safety inspection, which highlighted an issue with the sparsity of play-grade woodchip under play equipment, and exposed foundations. This is becoming very frustrating for families (and the Parish Council) especially in this good weather, and so, with the full agreement of the Play Area Group, who are masterminding the future play area, we are releasing some funds from the £25k that WPC allocated to the new project, to pay for new woodchip and equipment repairs. **So. watch out for the reopening of a safe play area!**

PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT

The Parish Council has had several residents making contact regarding future applications for developments in the Parish. As a consultee to Wealden District Council (who are the Planning Authority) we respond to applications once they are added to our Planning Agendas. Applications are added to our agendas after we are notified by Wealden of the official planning application. Residents and applicants are always welcome to attend our meetings to speak on agenda items and we allocate a ten minute period at the beginning of the meeting for this. The Parish Council does not undertake pre-application discussions with developers.

POST OFFICE

GROOMBRIDGE POST OFFICE

The council is continuing to make progress with securing the Post Office. As you know, we have set in motion the mechanisms to buy the building in which the Post Office is housed, as it will be so much more convenient for residents to continue to access the Post Office if it is part of the 'hub' of shops that are located in Groombridge. To date:

- A Building survey of the premises has been undertaken
- An application to the Public Works Loan Board (PWLB) has been made to enable the purchase of the building. This is a lending facility operated on behalf of HM Treasury for local authorities such as town and parish councils to fund capital projects.
- Our solicitor is to be instructed to start 1) conveyancing & 2) the commercial lease between WPC and the Community Interest Company which we have had to form.
- The contract with Post Office Ltd has been signed and returned, following an interview with the Clerk and the Chair, as two of the Directors of the Community Interest Company
- Architect plans are being finalised asap so that we may go out with specifications for conversion quotes
- A Building Group is overseeing checks on utilities and the separation of the residential part of the building from the Post Office to enable the high standard of security required by Post Office Ltd.

We now look forward to:

- Recruiting and training up a third Post Office staff member
- Negotiating job descriptions and contracts for existing members of staff; we couldn't do without their knowledge and experience, could we?!
- Members of the Post Office Retail Group advising on fit-out requirements and what needs to be done to establish a flourishing retail side
- Engaging and training volunteers for the retail side
- · Undertaking conversion and shop fitting

Some gardening tips for May

There's so much to do in the garden now that the spring sun has brought on a growth spurt. Keep sowing, mowing, weeding, watering and protecting young plants from the very last of the frosts by bringing them inside overnight or covering them with fleece.

Prune early spring flowering shrubs now that blossoms have finished.

This is the time to sow tender vegetables under protection, ready to plant out when all the risk of frost has passed. You could invest in a cloche or make your own smaller ones by cutting large pop bottles in half.

Watch out for slugs on new plantings. A cloche will help, or you could try traditional techniques such as crushed egg shells, coffee grounds or beer traps. Failing that, try copper tape around pot rims (which slugs don't like to cross) or slug pellets. Choose ferrous phosphate-based pellets rather than metaldehyde, which don't harm birds and will break back down into soil nutrients.

Online privacy

Online privacy is like an obstacle course in three main parts: getting online, finding things and visiting websites.

Getting online

Your internet provider has a legal duty to record your internet usage. When you travel, you will likely use insecure networks. In both cases, a virtual private network will help to protect you and obscure your internet usage. **ExpressVPN** is excellent.

Finding things

Google, Yahoo and Bing are impressive advertising companies... with free search facilities attached. Choose a search engine that forgets your searches: duckduckgo.com and qwant.com.

Visiting websites

Cookies are not the only show in the privacy circus. Tracking technology is evolving and your browser needs to evolve. Chrome and Edge share too much information. Choose **Firefox** with the *uBlock Origin* add-in or **Brave.**

James Butterwick

'Provenance Matters'

With the opening of Russia post-glasnost came a huge surge of interest in the Russian Avant-Garde. Previously unknown artists - Malevich, Popova, Filonov, Kliun and Lissitsky among them - became famous and much sought after by the new Russian buying public. With their reappearance however, came an industrial scale level of faking of their pictures, together with other artists of the period, often with the connivance, unwitting or otherwise, of Western and Russian experts.

Reputed specialists have estimated that as many as 95% of pictures on the market are unacceptable to any leading auction house, museum or dealer. This lecture will examine the evidence for and against such paintings, usually devoid of provenance and exhibition history, including attempts to 'sneak them under the radar' through exhibitions in Western institutions, as well as attempts to use the Western judicial system and fake news to help 'legalise' the works

James Butterwick began collecting and selling Russian Art in 1985 and has established himself as one of the world's leading experts. He moved to Moscow in 1994, becoming the only foreign member of the Russian Society of Private Collectors, and began forming collections, taking part in museum exhibitions and lecturing on Russian Art, including at the Tretyakov Gallery in Moscow and the Museum of Russian Impressionism.

James acts as a source of museum quality paintings with flawless provenance of both the Russian and European School and has access to all the leading experts, private collections and museums in any area of the Arts. He travels regularly to Russia, Ukraine and Kazakhstan where, in October 2013, he opened an exhibition of leading Impressionist paintings.

In 2015 James became the first gallery dealing in early 20th century Russian Art to be invited to exhibit at TEFAF, Maastricht, selling four works to the Kröller-Müller Museum. The following year saw a much-heralded personal exhibition of the Ukrainian avant-garde artist Alexander Bogomazov (1880-1930) with further sales to both Kröller-Müller and subsequently to the Arkansas Art Centre. James also exhibited at the first TEFAF New York fair in 2017.

Forthcoming Events in the Withyham Village Hall

Withyham AED – Automated External Defibrillator

We reported last year that there is now a defibrillator housed on the external wall of the Kings' Hall for use in a cardiac arrest emergency. The machine has a recorded sequence of messages to explain how to use the device; therefore it can be used by anyone in an emergency, allied to CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), particularly chest compressions. No shock will be applied unless the machine has detected that this is an appropriate course of action. Recently the machine was used; the responders were pleased to inform the Hall that it was easy to use and very reassuring, because they learned that the patient was not in cardiac arrest and so did not need a shock. The patient made a good recovery. However, the responders advised that many people they know were not aware that the machine was available, so we are repeating the notification. There are similar machines in both Hartfield and Groombridge, outside their village halls.
