



From the Rectory

Dear Friends,

People will forget what we say, they will forget what we do, but they will never forget how we made them feel', said Maya Angelu, an American poet and civil rights activist, on one occasion.

There is an instructive story near the beginning of the Bible about kindness. Abraham had sent his servant Eliezer to find a wife for his son Isaac. Standing by a small town well, Eliezer prayed, "Let the woman who offers to water my camels be the one you have chosen." Suddenly Rebecca turns up and says, "I will draw water for your camels also," (Genesis 24:13-14). Rebecca had no idea that meeting Eliezer and being kind to him would change her life.

In the Old Testament times it was customary to offer water from a well to a stranger. It was known as the law of hospitality. In the New Testament the author of the Book of Hebrews wrote, *Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some have unwittingly entertained angels.* But who'd offer to provide water for camels? One camel alone can drink forty gallons, and Eliezer had ten of them! The task would have taken literally hours, but Rebecca obviously did what she was used to doing – just getting on with life and always looking to help others in the everyday routines of life.

It is striking too that Rebecca was generous to a stranger. She didn't know this man or that these well-watered camels would lead her to Isaac, whom she would marry and so become a member of the family whose lineage would include Jesus himself.

As someone put it, perhaps the message of Rebecca is, 'if you want to succeed, show up on time, stay focused, work hard and be a problem solver not a problem causer'; live by Jesus' maxim in Matthew 5 to 'go the extra mile.'

Camels can be romantic from a distance, pictured in a desert landscape; they can travel at up to 40 mph; but at closer quarters are big and ugly. Yet from her engagement with them, Rebecca's life was changed. As we emerge from the restrictions that we've been living with for 18 months, kindness that goes the extra mile and blesses others will be precious.

Churchwardens' Notes

We look forward to welcoming visitors to Withyham Church for the Flower Festival which runs from Saturday August 28th to Monday August 30th from 10am until 5pm each day. Entry is free, with donations to Hospice in the Weald and Withyham Church. Refreshments will be available.

There have been complaints about the state of the churchyard. McNaughton's have said that the wet summer has made grass cutting difficult, especially with the extra growth the rain has encouraged. They now inform me that due to staff shortages and other commitments they will find it difficult to keep up with the grass cutting. With a large churchyard and limited budget we keep the old churchyard in a wild state which is ecologically friendly and cut the new churchyard and certain paths in the old churchyard. Hopefully in the Autumn, unlike last year, we can have a churchyard clear up.

Dear Friends,

The summer holidays are now in full swing and we are so pleased that we have been able to organise some activities for our families, who have been desperate for a change of scenery after all these months in lockdown. We have had a day at Arundel Castle Cricket club, which included forest school and meditation and was greatly enjoyed by both parents and children. There have also been trips to the beach and circus visits, as well as individual family outings for those who cannot cope with large groups.

Our foodbank is in greater need during these holiday weeks as we try to provide food which is normally given through free school meals, and we would like to thank all those who have been collecting for us. Although our stores have improved a little, we are still in need of most items to keep the shelves adequately stocked – particularly tinned fruit and vegetables, jams and spreads.

We held our first staff day in the middle of July, which was the first time for 2 years that the whole staff team were able to see each other in person and catch up on each other's news. It was wonderful to share stories, and we were delighted to have been joined by the outgoing Lord Lieutenant of East Sussex, Sir Peter Field. You can see photos from the day on our Facebook page.

We are looking forward to our sponsored walk from Amberley to Arundel later this week, our first mass participation event for such a long time. We have also recommenced our speaking engagements at churches and have been delighted to update congregations on our activities over the last 18 months. EXPLORING SOFTWARE ALTERNATIVES - Roger Lyon

Buying general-purpose software used to be like buying furniture: simply pay for what you need in a single purchase. Today, many software makers are encouraging, or even demanding, recurring subscription licences rather than a single payment. Why is this happening and what are your options?

Writing complex software is expensive and requires the collaboration of many skilled people. Running a business can be challenging when users buy just once every few years.

Microsoft's Office subscription can be a pretty good deal; a number of users can share the same licence at a pinch. However, there are other suites offering word-processor, spreadsheet and presentation makers. WPS Office has all this free and prides itself on working with Microsoft's files. The long time stalwart offerings of LibreOffice and OpenOffice are also popular options.

Closely allied to office suite software is desktop publishing. This is dominated by Adobe, which has moved to fairly hefty monthly retainers. Instead, why not consider the powerful and freely-available *Scribus* produced by a bunch of generous geeks, or the modestly priced *Affinity Publisher*. *Affinity Publisher* is part of a suite of programs for all your design, photo editing and publishing requirements.

Powerful photo-editing is another Adobe-dominated domain. In a recent move, Adobe are offering their *Lightroom* and *Photoshop* software for £10 per month. There are excellent alternatives available including *Luminar 4* and *ON1*, behind whose curious names lie remarkably powerful packages. Do check out *Luminar's* other software - they have an Al-powered version which is fun and offers new capabilities.

Finally, turning to music production, the venerable *Cakewalk* is now alive, up-to-date and freely available.

Your software purchase is an opportunity to encourage the smaller players to inject healthy variety into the software market. Take a look at the website for more information and links. RLComputerSolutions.co.uk/software

Circular walk from Blackham along the Sussex Border Path

Length: about 4 miles - Time: 2 hours max

This walk is pretty flat and not very demanding, but some parts are a bit muddy at the moment and there are some areas of long wet grass and undergrowth, so walking boots or wellies will be required, and it might be wise to avoid shorts or short-sleeved shirts. A compass and an Ordnance Survey map are always useful; if you don't have an OS map, you'll find something helpful at https://www.bing.com/maps?osid=d98453c5-10fd-4d13-b458-299ee1306782&cp=51.142578~0.135751&lvl=15&style=s&imgid=4925f0e6-e5e0-4922-9e7f-0f7b383a6c23&v=2&sV=2&form=S00027 and you may well find that your smartphone has a compass on it (assuming you can find a small child to show you how to work it, of course). All references to crops are correct at the time of writing, but naturally may look completely different if you do this walk in a few weeks time!

Start from the junction of Ironchurch Lane & Willetts Lane and walk N along Ironchurch Lane towards the church. At the church turn L and then fork right at a house called "Chippings", down the drive to Nore Farm. There are good views to the R towards Hobbs Hill Farm & beyond. At the gates of Nore Farm turn L along a grassy path, which could be muddy. Carry on uphill and through a metal gate. You should now have Tollhurst Farm on your L and at the time of writing, a field of maize to your right. Carry on to another metal gate which carries a rather worrying "Beware of the Bull" sign. I saw no bulls however, just a few very benign cows. I gave them a courteously wide berth and proceeded diagonally right, past a pond, to another metal gate at the bottom of the field. If you have a dog with you, it <u>must</u> be on a short lead at this point. On the exceedingly rare occasions when people have been injured by cattle, it's often because the animals have been stirred up by an unrestrained, excitable dog. This is particularly important if the cows have calves with them. Go through the gate and straight on along another grassy track, again with maize to the right. Ignore a path off to the left and carry straight on, slightly downhill, through another metal gate and into a little strip of woodland, soon heading uphill again. As you emerge at the top, about 100 yards before a road, turn R along a narrow path between hedges. There is a post here with a yellow marker "H66". Proceed downhill to a crossroads of tracks, with footbridges to the L and straight ahead. Turn R here, in an easterly direction through a little patch of scrub, into a field. You are now on the Sussex Border Path. Turn L along the field edge, with a large patch of Himalayan Balsam to your L, and beyond that a stream called Kent Water, which forms the boundary with Kent. (Cont.....)

I have seen lapwings in this field, but sadly not recently. At the field corner, bear left along a narrow path into some scrubby woodland and continue along in an easterly direction, still with Kent Water to your L. Cross 2 wooden footbridges and enter a field of maize. Turn L along the field edge, with woodland on the L and maize to your R. You should soon be able to pick out a railway embankment in the trees to the L. Bend round to the R and then look out for another wooden footbridge to your L, which could be a bit overgrown and hidden. Cross this bridge and carry on along the edge of the field as before. Eventually, the path turns left under the railway. As you emerge on the other side, you are presented with another field of maize. The path continues across the field, slightly to the R, which may seem impossible, but if you look closely you will see two narrow gaps through the crop, about a tractor's width apart. These are a bit shy of the metre-wide strip that farmers are supposed to leave along rights of way, but this is not the place to bang on about that. So, grit your teeth, thank your lucky stars you heeded my advice about suitable clothing, and sally forth into the maize. Emerging on the other side, hopefully unscathed, continue straight on along the field edge as before, with the maize to your R and scrubby woodland & Kent Water to your L. Bend to the R, then fork L, still keeping Kent Water to your L. Continue along, and eventually you will see in front of you a wooden stile with a gap next to it. Go through the gap and you should soon see, diagonally to your L, a metal gate and a smart new wooden footbridge. Cross the bridge (into Kent), turn immediately R (east), and continue along to a wide metal farm gate. Go through the gateway (could be muddy) and continue along a fairly narrow track which bends gradually R. Emerge into a field and carry on in the direction of a house in the distance. As you near the house, bear over towards a small stile in the R corner of the field. Cross this stile onto a towards a small stile in the R corner of the field. Cross this stile onto a road. Cross the road very carefully, turn R and then immediately L into a long field, with Villa Golf Course to your R. Walk right along to the end of the field, to a gap in the hedge with a wooden footbridge. Go over the bridge and taking care to show due courtesy to the golfers and avoid flying golf balls, pass round to the R of the green towards a metal gate. Go through the gate & along the R edge of the field, with the golf course on your R. Cross a wooden footbridge, with a sort of metal stile at either end, and turn immediately R along the field edge. Soon reach another smart new wooden footbridge on your R, which you should cross and then continue across the field towards the buildings of Willetts Farm. Continue through the farmyard and along the track. As you leave the farm behind there are lovely views in all directions. Carry on over the railway and along Willetts Lane to the starting point.
